Scripture

Scriptural reflections on singing, especially in worship.

There are over 400 references to singing.

Exodus 15:1-2 Then Moses and the people of Israel sang this song to the Lord, saying,

"I will sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider he has thrown into the sea.

² The Lord is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him."

1 Chronicles 16:9 Sing to him; sing praises to him, tell of all his wondrous works!

1 Chronicles 16:23 Sing to the LORD, all the earth! Tell of his salvation from day to day.

Job 38:7 The morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy.

Psalm 63:3-4 Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you.

⁴ So I will bless you as long as I live; in your name I will lift up my hands.

Psalm 89:1, 5 I will sing of the steadfast love of the Lord, forever; with my mouth I will make known your faithfulness to all generations. ⁵ Let the heavens praise your wonders, O Lord, your faithfulness in the assembly of the holy ones!

Psalm 95:1-2 Oh come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!

² Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!

Psalm 100:1-2, 4 Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth!

- ² Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing!
- ⁴ Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise!

Give thanks to him; bless his name!

Psalm 104:33 I will sing to the Lord as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have being.

Psalm 150:1-6 Praise the Lord!

Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens!

- ² Praise him for his mighty deeds; praise him according to his excellent greatness!
- ³ Praise him with trumpet sound; praise him with lute and harp!
- ⁴ Praise him with tambourine and dance; praise him with strings and pipe!
- ⁵ Praise him with sounding cymbals; praise him with loud clashing cymbals!
- ⁶ Let everything that has breath praise the Lord! Praise the Lord!

Isaiah 35:10 The ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain gladness and joy, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

- Isaiah 44:23 Sing, O heavens, for the Lord has done it; shout, O depths of the earth; break forth into singing, O mountains, O forest, and every tree in it! For the Lord has redeemed Jacob, and will be glorified in Israel.
- Isaiah 49:13 Sing for joy, O heavens, and exult, O earth; break forth, O mountains, into singing! For the Lord has comforted his people and will have compassion on his afflicted.
- *Matthew 26:30* When they [Jesus and His disciples] had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.
- *Luke 19:39-40* Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples." ⁴⁰ He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out."
- Acts 16:25 About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.
- **Ephesians 5:18b-20** Be filled with the Spirit, ¹⁹ addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, ²⁰ giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- Colossians 3:16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.
- Hebrews 2:12 I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will sing your praise.
- James 5:13 Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise.
- **Revelation 5:9-12** They sang a new song, saying,
 - "Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation,
 - ¹⁰ and you have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they shall reign on the earth."
 - ¹¹ Then I looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, ¹² saying with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain,
 - to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!"
